Everett Drexel Blevins (1948-2019)

Everett Drexel Blevins, known to many as Coach Drex, completed his service on Earth, October 31, 2019, at the age of 71. After fighting multiple cancers for many years, Drex passed away peacefully in Gulf Shores, AL, with his cherished son, Jim Blevins; daughter-in-law, Catherine Blevins; and best friend and former wife, Alma Murphy, by his side. He summed up his life with a quote he gave to the Mobile Register, "I just like to help people." He lived a life of service, and all who knew him were deeply impacted by his presence in their life.

Drex found great joy in giving the gift of tennis to others. Through teaching, he created a following of faithful students and friends, giving counsel—on and off the court. He taught thousands of people, including his pride-and-joy, and only son, Jim. The time they spent together on the tennis court and traveling to tournaments created a special and unique bond that will never be broken—even in death.

In his retirement, Drex sacrificially gave of his time by volunteering as the head coach of Gulf Shores High School for many years. He also lived and taught in Katy, TX several years, where he was able to spend time with his son and grandchildren. He spent his last months teaching in Gulf Shores and hanging out with long-time friends at the Pink Pony Pub.

During the Vietnam War, Drex served as a supply clerk from 1968-1970, receiving the Bronze Star Medal. He also earned several sharp shooting awards while honorably serving his country. Upon his return into civilian life, Drex found his career at the Middletown Fire Department. This career allowed him to continue teaching tennis, while maintaining his sense of civic duty. Drex earned many accolades as a fireman, including Firefighter of the Year in 1985 and 1991. He was the first firemedic to achieve this distinction twice, given to him by his colleagues.

He was preceded in death by his father, James Blevins, Jr., and mother, Ruth Clem Blevins. He is survived by two brothers, Walter Blevins (Middletown, OH) and Alan Blevins (The Villages, FL); son, Jim Blevins and wife, Catherine (Katy, TX); seven grandchildren, Jessica Blevins Holt and husband Ronnie, Emily Blevins Southern and husband, Tim, Wright Baber, John Blevins, Ensley Baber, Thomas Blevins, and Harry McCaskill, IV; and

great-granddaughter, Ava Grace Southern.

A memorial service will be held at The Lodge at Gulf State Park, overlooking the beach, in Gulf Shores, Dec. 14, 2019 at 4 p.m. Please wear white in his honor.

The family wishes to thank all who have supported them during this time, including the wonderful nurses and staff of Community Hospice and so many friends and family.
