Louie was 91 years young and born on July 21st, 1929 in Jackson, Michigan. He met his wife, Dwilla "Ozzie" (Osborn), his soulmate, at Jackson High School. They were married on May 6th, 1950 and have been married for 71 years.

They have four children, Lynda (Mike) Proehl, Doug (Sue) Lubahn, Sue (Bill) Yeakle and Kathy (Dave) Bank. They have 14 Grandchildren and 19 Great Grandchildren, who will all miss their "Grandpa Lou". He was also blessed with a special brother-in-law, sister-in-law, cousins, many nieces/nephews, friends and most recently a crew of Angel caregivers.

He was active in the Air Force and was stationed at four U.S. Air Force Bases and served his country in Japan and Korea before returning to his home state of Michigan. He served the USAF from 1951 to 1955, during the Korean War, attaining the rank of Staff Sgt.

He retired from Michigan Bell/AT&T after 44 years as an expert

Telecommunications Manager and consultant for Dow Corning.

The family had many fun memories at their cabin at Houghton Lake. He taught us all the love of the outdoors, which included waterskiing, motorcycling, snowmobiling, sailing, fishing, canoeing and always stopping to mushroom hunt.

His hobbies were gardening, fishing, hunting and golfing. He was very proud of his garden, orchards and meadows at their home in Arcadia, MI. He absolutely loved the outdoors. The other prideful hobby was that he was a licensed Ham Radio Operator.

Singing with his Barbershop chorus group, Four Winds, was his favorite way to spend time with friends in Alabama. He also loved a good conversation and a long game of cards, especially Euchre.

He and Ozzie spent solitude hours and hours watching wildlife on their porch, which included many birds, deer, turtles and gators.

They had a love to travel and adventure, which included trips to Europe, Alaska, Hawaii, bus trips and many cruises

One of Louie's proudest conversation starters was that he shook hands and worked with 5 Presidents of the United States. He supported the military with pride and was an active member of the Elks, VFW and Lions Club.
