Dallas Frank Wyatt, 91, of Foley, Alabama, was called home to be with the Lord on May 22, 2025. A beloved father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and faithful servant of Christ, Dallas leaves behind a legacy of love, generosity, and unwavering faith.

Born in Brantley, Alabama, on March 4, 1934, to Robert and Lillie Mae Little Wyatt, Dallas was the eldest of four children. He is preceded in death by his parents; his brothers, Robert Morris Wyatt and Thomas Wyatt; and his beloved wife of 69 years, Edna Earl Wyatt. He is survived by his sister, Libby Wyatt Chandler.

A dedicated member of the Foley Church of Christ, Dallas served faithfully as an elder and spiritual leader for many years. His life was a reflection of his deep commitment to Christ, his family, and serving others. He was known for his kind heart, infectious smile, and the playful jokes he shared with those he loved.

Dallas was also an avid gardener, often found tending to his fruits and vegetables, which he joyfully shared with neighbors and friends. A lover of music, he took great joy in creating and gifting CDs of his favorite gospel quartets, bluegrass, and country music.

Above all, Dallas will be remembered for his generous spirit, steadfast faith, and the deep love he had for his family and community. He is now joyfully reunited with Edna, his partner in life and faith.
