Dave was a big history buff and often could be found watching the History channel and was ready to debate historical events. He loved going to the casino and enjoyed the slot machines. He was guilty of often spoiling his grandchildren. Dave always had a beloved pet and most recently was spoiling his dog Bandit.

Dave and his wife Dorla enjoyed traveling and visited many places including the Grand Canyon, Las Vegas, Branson Missouri, Niagara Falls, and throughout the Midwest. They spent a lot of time in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan as Dave had family there. At one point, they owned several acres in Northern Michigan that they used for camping and easier access to the Upper Peninsula. They remodeled several homes and could often be found rearranging the layout of their home.

Dave wished to join his wife Dorla in Michigan for his final resting place. A private family memorial was held in Gulf Shores, Alabama. In the spring the family will plan a memorial for friends and family that will take place in Michigan. The exact date will be determined.

Dave fought a long hard battle against lung cancer and needed many blood transfusions. It was due to the blood donations of strangers that Dave could fight so long and hard. The family asks that those who could would donate blood to help another family continue the battle against cancer.

He was a loving husband, father, and grandfather who was greatly loved and will be deeply missed.
