She was strong in many ways, especially when she had to fight breast cancer twice and was a survivor.

Ozzie was an incredible cook and this love for cooking was appreciated by all. The family will miss her amazing meals, such as; pork chops/milk gravy/mashed potatoes, roast beef, fried chicken, "shit on a shingle" and swiss steak dinners.

She enjoyed playing cards, especially euchre, with family and friends. She thoroughly enjoyed these opportunities to socialize with everyone. Ozzie and Louie treasured their time playing cards and games with others.

The family had many great memories at their childhood homes that she made so comfortable in Jackson, Okemos and Freeland. There were especially fun memories at their cabin at Houghton Lake. She would join in with the family on motorcycle and snowmobiling trips. She was a good sport when it came to boating and on rare occasion even sailing. We all loved the big breakfasts she made and time we had at the cabin.

Before the loss of Louie, they spent solitude hours and hours watching wildlife on their porch, which included many birds, deer, turtles and gators. They had a love to travel and adventure, which included trips to Europe, Alaska, Hawaii, bus trips and many cruises
