



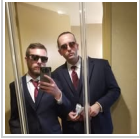
Mr Homer Maxwell

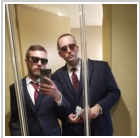

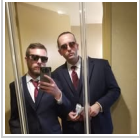

and most sincere condolences to his family. He was truly a beloved friend to all of us.

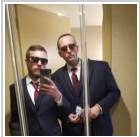
