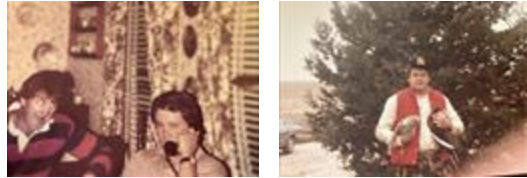
1956 – 2023

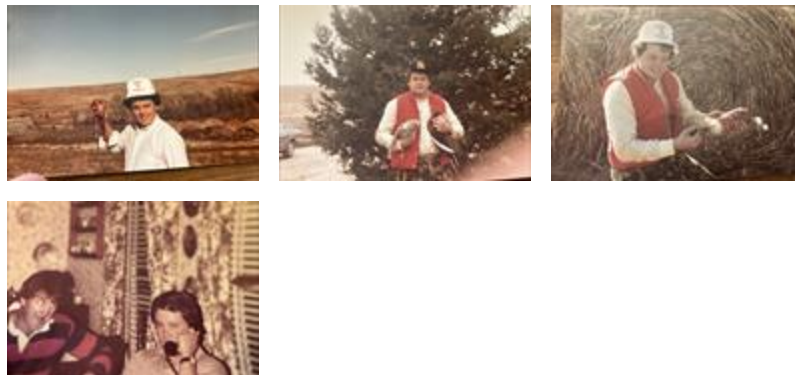

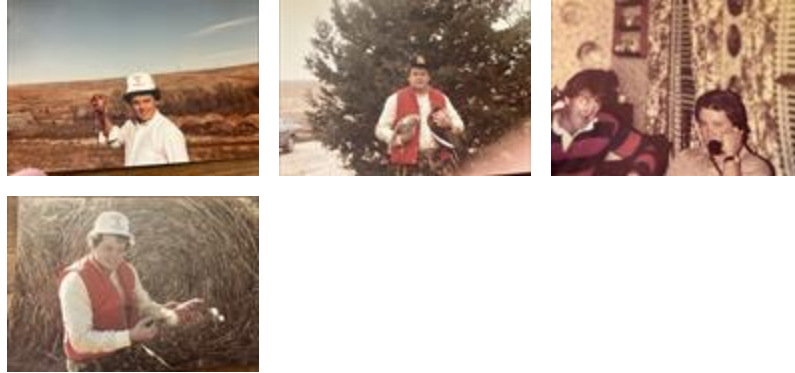
