June Campbell Surface, age 99, passed away peacefully in her sleep on November 10, 2021 in Gulf Shores, AL.

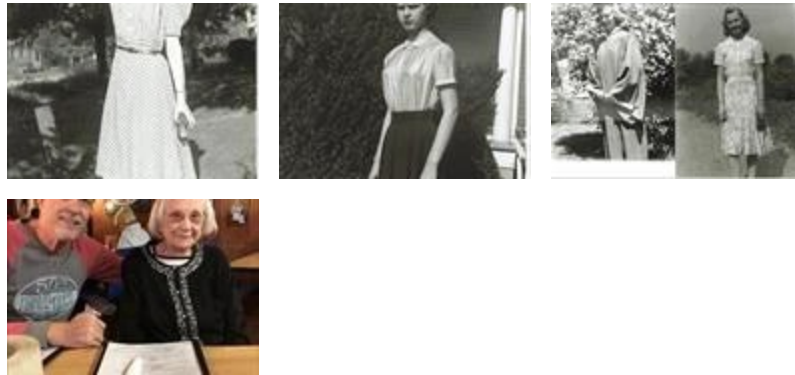
