Matthew Francis Mudd was born on September 3, 1964 to Glendolyn and George F. Mudd, U.S. Lincoln Highway 30, Matteson, Illinois. Matt lived in a small community, like many of his ancestors, and enjoyed the freedom of roaming open spaces, and finding treasures. The Mudd family moved to Denver, Colorado in 1970, and Matt attended school at St. Philomena and Teller Elementary. Dad's office was west, so the family moved to Lakewood, and Matt attended Creighton Junior and Lakewood High School. He worked at a local restaurant, did landscaping and loved woodworking. He made a beautiful redwood picnic table for his parents, which they cherished.

Matthew had severe mental health illness that affected his quality of life for many years. He participated in a national preliminary trial of a new chemical breakthrough for schizophrenia treatment, and began to experience true emotions of joy, laughter, clear thought, and finally could participate in social activities. Fifteen years ago, Matthew purchased his own home and furniture. He moved to Foley, Alabama in 2007, walked daily, loved swimming and snorkeling in the Gulf of Mexico, just a few miles from his home on U.S. Highway 98.

Matthew Francis Mudd is survived by his three sisters, Elizabeth Mudd-Connelly, Foley, Susan Mudd Powell, Chandler, Arizona, Kathleen Sawyer, Parker, Colorado, one brother, Martin G. Mudd, of Lakewood, Colorado. Locally, he is survived by his Aunts and Uncles, Rose Billie and Mike Melton of Gulf Shores, and Donna and Bernie Tindall of Foley. His father's sisters,
