Neil had such a good heart, he loved the kids and especially the dogs in the neighborhood, he would always have a snack for the dogs. He knew the dogs' names before he knew the neighbors names.

Per Neil's wishes he will be cremated. There will be no formal service at this time.

Neil was retired from the U.S. Government, Navy (Active Duty), Navy (Civilian), and Dept of Veteran Affairs with over 34 years of combined federal service.
