He then went to work for Vinton Limited in England and also Exotic Materials in CA as an Optical Engineer. Bob owned AV Electronics while living in Hawaii and retired from Sound Track in Colorado. Bob's lifetime love was trains, where he earned the nickname "Santa Fe Bob". Bob was an active and respected member of the Foley Caboose Club, Emerald Coast Railroad Club and South West Alabama Railroad Modelers (SWARM). Bob also had a love for travelling with his wife Heather and was always eager to experience new places, people and memories. Bob, along with his wife Heather, was active in

animal rescue, fostering cats and caring for feral cats, along with transporting rescue dogs.

He was preceded in death by his parents, daughter Kathy and son John. He is survived by his wife of 24

years, Heather Moore and goddaughter Kendra Chance.
